## **ROSE SHOW RULES**

### **1. No Exhibitor Registration Required**

Challenge class 43 is limited as noted in the schedule. All rose specimens must have been grown by the exhibitor in his/her own private garden. No garden may be represented by more than one exhibitor or team of exhibitors. Entries will be accepted between 7:00 am and 10:00 am ONLY on September 30, 2017.

### **2. Multiple Entries**

As many entries as desired may be made in each class, provided each entry is a different variety or combination of varieties. Duplicate entries will be disqualified.

### **3. Official Entry Tags**

Tags will be provided by the show committee. **Both top and bottom of each tag must be completed.**

### **4. Containers**

Containers will be provided by the show committee on a first come, first serve basis. Exhibitors may furnish their own English boxes and pick them up at the close of the show. Multiple specimen entries are to be staged in single containers.

### **5. Wedges**

Foil, plastic, or Styrofoam may be used to position a specimen but should not protrude above the container. All roses shall be exhibited with at least 3 inches of stem in the water, miniatures  
1 ½ inches in the water.

### **6. Rose names**

Entries must be properly listed in the current edition of either: Modern Roses, Handbook for Selecting Roses, The American Rose Annual, The American Rose Magazine or International Register of New Rose Varieties. Classification shall be according to the most recent of the publications. A rose with two or more names must be entered under its ARS approved name or code name.

### **7. Novice/Amateur**

Novice class is limited to exhibitors who have never won a blue ribbon in an ARS accredited show. Novices also may enter other show classes.

## **8. Old Garden Roses**

Any variety whose HORTICULTURAL CLASSIFICATION existed prior to 1867. The variety itself may have been introduced at any date. However, to be eligible for the Dowager Queen, the variety must have been in existence before 1867. To be eligible for the Victorian Award, the variety must have originated in or after 1867 or have an unknown date of introduction. Side buds and sprays are permitted.

## **9. Fully Open**

Roses must show stamens, which must be fresh. Excessive removal of central petals will be penalized.

## **10. Exhibition Stage**

Except as noted, each specimen should be at EXHIBITION STAGE ( $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$  open, with petals arranged symmetrically in an attractive circular outline tending toward a high center.) Fully open is an exhibition stage for some varieties. ONE BLOOM PER STEM entries must be shown without side buds.

## **11. Sprays**

Sprays must have two or more blooms and are judged for overall form, individual floret form and inflorescence.

## **12. Climbers**

Large flowered climbers (LCI) and Ramblers are to be entered in Section R. All other roses with the word "climbing" as a part of the horticultural classification are to be entered in the same classes as their respective bush counterparts.

## **13. English Boxes and Palettes**

ARS rules for these will be followed. Overall appearance will replace the points normally allotted to stem and foliage.

## **14. Shrubs**

A. **Modern Shrubs:** Best shrub rose that does not have a family connection, but is designated in the ARS pub as a shrub.

B. **Classic Shrub Rose:** Unwanted side growth may be removed. Best shrub from the following three shrub classes: Hybrid Musk (Hmsk), Hybrid Rugosa (Hrg), Kordesii (Hkor).

C. **Genesis class:** Best rose designated as species (SP) in ARS publications.

D. **David Austin Roses:** Individual specimen may be one bloom per stem or spray. *Shrub roses are NOT ELIGIBLE for Dowager or Victorian awards.*

### **15. Entries**

All entries will become the property of the show committee. Wilted roses will be removed by the show committee.

### **16. Placement**

No entry may be withdrawn after it has been placed. The placement committee will place all entries alphabetically by variety WITHIN EACH CLASS. Entries in Class **16 & 35** are to be placed by the exhibitor. ONCE PLACED, THESE ENTRIES MAY NOT BE MOVED.

### **17. Judging**

Judging shall be done by ARS accredited judges who may be assisted by ARS apprentice judges.

### **18. Awards**

Ribbons may be awarded to each variety or combination of varieties in a class, but only if merited.

The Hybrid Tea Queen, King, Princess, and Queen's Court will be selected from one bloom per stem Hybrid Teas and Grandifloras in Classes 11, 29 and 43.

Corresponding Miniature royalty winners will be selected from Classes 30A Miniature & 30B Miniflora blue ribbon winners.

**No exhibit or award will be removed from the show until 4:00 pm on Saturday, September 30, 2017**

## **GUIDELINES FOR JUDGING:**

A. **Point Scale:** *Form 25, Substance 15, Color 20, Stem & Foliage 20, Balance & Proportion 10, Size 10.*

B. Stem length must be pleasing in relationship to the size of the bloom. Roses with stems too long or too short are penalized.

C. Side growth, side buds, or spent blooms may be skillfully removed to improve appearance and avoid penalty.

D. **Specimens will be disqualified for the following reasons:**

1. Improperly named, classed or labeled entries.
2. Stem on Stem, except for old garden roses.
3. Foreign substance applied to improve appearance.
4. Side buds when must be shown dis-budded.
5. Violation of ARS or local show rules.
6. Appearance of exhibitor's name on tag other than in designated area for name.

### **DIVISION 1 HORTICULTURAL**

#### **SECTION H: HYBRID TEAS AND GRANDIFLORAS**

**CLASS 11 One bloom per stem.**

Awards: Queen, King, Princess & 4 Court  
ARS Certificates: Gold, Silver and Bronze

**CLASS 12 SPRAY** (See rule 11) - Award

**CLASS 14 THREE one bloom per stem. SAME VARIETY.**

One vase - Award

**CLASS 15 FIVE one bloom per stem. ALL DIFFERENT VARIETIES.** One vase - Award

**CLASS 16 VERNON RICKARD CHALLENGE**

Five one bloom per stem Hybrid Teas and or Grandifloras, exhibited in five containers each tagged individually. Placed by the exhibitor. Once placed, it cannot be moved except by the exhibitor. See rule 16. - Award

**CLASS 17 - CYCLE OF BLOOM**

One bud  $\frac{1}{4}$  open and showing color, one exhibition stage bloom, and one fully open bloom; same variety. - Award

**CLASS 18 FULLY OPEN** One bloom per stem. (See rule 9).

- Award

**CLASS 19 ENGLISH BOX**

Exhibition stage. Six blooms, no foliage, no more than two of any variety. Must list varieties on separate card. - Award

**CLASS 20 FLOATING HYBRID TEA**

One bloom at exhibition stage, foliage not permitted. Bloom floats on water which fills glass  $\frac{2}{3}$  full. - Award

## **SECTION F: FLORIBUNDAS**

**CLASS 21 ONE BLOOM PER STEM.** - Award

**CLASS 22 SPRAY** (See rule 11). Award

**CLASS 23 PALETTE** - Award

Five blooms of same or different varieties with no foliage.

## **SECTION P: POLYANTHAS**

**CLASS 24 SPRAY.** (See rule 11). Award

## **SECTION O: OLD GARDEN ROSES.**

**CLASS 25 DOWAGER QUEEN** – ARS Certificate - Award  
(Rule 8). Best Old Garden Rose Introduced before 1867

**CLASS 26 ALL OTHER VARIETIES.** Victorian Certificate  
Best Old Garden Rose Introduced 1867 or after. - Award

## **SECTION R: LARGE FLOWERING CLIMBERS AND RAMBLERS**

**CLASS 27 SPRAY OR ONE BLOOM PER STEM.** - Award

## **SECTION S: SHRUBS**

**CLASS 28A MODERN SHRUB.** One bloom per stem or spray.  
(See rule 14A). ARS Certificate – Award

**CLASS 28B CLASSIC SHRUB.** One bloom per stem or spray.  
(See rule 14B). ARS Certificate - Award

**CLASS 28C GENESIS CLASS.** One bloom per stem or spray.  
(See rule 14C). Species Only - ARS Certificate - Award

**CLASS 28D DAVID AUSTIN ROSES.** Individual specimen may be one bloom  
per stem or spray. ARS Certificate – Award

**SECTION N: NOVICE (See rule 7, p. 4)**

**CLASS 29 HYBRID TEAS, GRANDIFLORAS, SHRUBS, FLORIBUNDAS, MINIFLORAS AND MINIATURES.** Award

Spray or one bloom per stem. ARS Certificate

**SECTION M: MINIATURES AND MINIFLORAS**

**CLASS 30A MINIATURE.** One bloom per stem.

Awards: Queen, King, & Princess

ARS Certificates: Gold, Silver and Bronze

**CLASS 30B MINIFLORA.** One bloom per stem.

Awards: Queen, King, & Princess

ARS Certificates: Gold, Silver and Bronze

**CLASS 31 SPRAY. M/MF** (See rule 11). Award

**CLASS 32 SINGLE M/MF (5-12 PETALS)** One Bloom. Award

**CLASS 33 THREE ONE BLOOM PER STEM.** Same variety - Award

**CLASS 34 FIVE, ONE BLOOM PER STEM.** All different varieties listed on back of entry tag. - Award

**CLASS 35 MARLYON WRIGHT MEMORIAL**

**MINIATURE/MINIFLORA CHALLENGE**

A collection of five Miniature and or Miniflora roses of different varieties exhibited in separate containers and tagged individually. Placed by exhibitor. Once placed the exhibit cannot be moved. - Award

**CLASS 36 CYCLE OF BLOOM** Same requirements as Class 17. - Award

**CLASS 37 FULLY OPEN**

One bloom, more than 12 petals. (See rule 9). - Award

**CLASS 38 ENGLISH BOX**

Same requirements as Class 19. - Award

**CLASS 39 PALETTE** - Five blooms of same or different varieties with no foliage.

- Award

**CLASS 40 CHAMPAGNE FLOAT**

Same requirements as Class 20. - Award

**CLASS 41 MINIATURE/MINIFLORA ROSE BOUQUET**

All left over roses, any number, any stage, at least three different varieties, displayed in provided container. -Award

**SECTION J: JUDGES**

**CLASS 42 JUDGES' CLASS - Award**

Any number of roses, any varieties; that express your love of roses. Containers provided by the judges or show committee.

**SECTION C: CHALLENGE

**CLASS 43 ONE BLOOM PER STEM HYBRID TEA, GRANDIFLORAS OR FLORIBUNDAS. - Award**

**SECTION D: CHALLENGE CLASSES**

(Open to All Exhibitors)

**CLASS 44 FRAGRANCE** – One bloom of any variety judged by exhibitors and the public for fragrance alone. - Award

**CLASS 45 ROSE BOUQUET**

All left over roses, any number, any stage of bloom displayed in container provided by exhibitor. At least three different varieties. - Award

**CLASS 46 IDENTIFICATION**

Spray or one bloom per stem with description of bush growth. This class provided only to identify unknown roses. No Award.
